

# Future simple with 'Will'



The future simple is used to talk about:

- 1. Future intentions at the moment of speaking.
- 2. Predictions about the future.
- 3. Future facts.



Affirmative: Subject + Will + infinitive verb



They will play football this weekend.

Negative: Subject + will not/won't + infinitive verb



She won't attend the meeting.

**Question:** Will + Subject + infinitive verb



Will you visit your friend this weekend?



at the weekend
in a minute / an hour / a day / the future
in two days
on Monday
next week / month / year
this weekend / month / year
the day after tomorrow
tonight

tomorrow morning / afternoon / evening
